


Dear friends in Cleir Eilean I,

You may remember that our fully funded Cairn Learning Community begins on Friday 4 and Saturday 5 October, in Inverness: Inshes East for those who can make it, and online for those too far afield to be there in person.

We have some churches signed up to join in, but we'd love some more! If you know you are signing up and bringing some of your leaders along, please do sign up using the attached Google Form. 



RETREAT - Kilmalieu, Abernethy

I'm not sure if you saw the article in the Life and Work this month, but a new Christian retreat centre has been established at Kilmalieu on the west coast, about 20 miles from Fort William. In one sense it is 'new', but in another we are restoring what was an important place of prayer in the early days of Christianity in Scotland.

The seeds of the vision for developing this place of prayer and hospitality were sown during my 15 years as a Mission Development Worker for the Church of Scotland, when I realised the value and importance of opportunities for people, especially those in church leadership, to slow down, pray and reflect – sometimes gathering with others, sometimes in solitude.

During the coming months we plan to offer some free-of-charge opportunities for church leaders (and their spouses if appropriate) to come and experience an overnight retreat here. If that might be of interest to you, please get in touch.

Kilmalieu is a 3000-acre estate, a place of rugged beauty, hills, coastline and woodlands. The main accommodation is a renovated eighteenth-century hunting lodge, with a variety of comfortable rooms. Guests have access to a small library, chapel, art room, games room and gym. A fire pit and are also BBQ available.


In addition to the main house, a separate lodge in the grounds overlooks Loch Linnhe and provides a comfortable base for a self-catered retreat for an individual, couple or group of 3 or 4 people.

As well as offering scheduled retreats (which you can see on the website by <u>clicking here</u>), the centre also offers an ideal base for small groups (up to 24, depending on the configuration of singles, couples etc.) and we would love to host groups from churches around Scotland. No group is too small. We can offer input or guidance from our team here – or just provide the hospitality for visitors to do their own thing.




It's time to register babies born in 2024!

MODERATORS MISSION PROJECT

Our Moderator, Rev Doug McRoberts, at Al Shurooq School for Blind Children, in Bethlehem, as featured at our June Presbytery meeting... Doug has asked that churches throughout Clèir Eilean Ì consider supporting this school, and Jeel al Amal orphanage and school in Bethany, with prayers and fundraising. Both work with disadvantaged children – including some from Gaza – almost entirely through voluntary donations. Both, of course, are beyond the Separation Wall from Israel. And both depend on the direct support of McCabe Educational Trust (MET) – the charity arm of McCabe Pilgrimages. Until the 7th October atrocity, and the war in Gaza which followed. MET was funding Christian-led care and education of children (of any faith) in the West Bank and elsewhere, children who are blind, deaf, orphaned or poor – and sometimes more than one of those things, spending about £250,000 a year, all of it raised through charity donations. But there is now an urgent need; a recent report from MET said: Up until October 75% of McCabe's pilgrims were visiting the Holy Land; for the last ten months this has been impossible... The income of MET has halved virtually overnight; we are fast running out of money. But the needs of the children we have been supporting have more than doubled. At Jeel the MET has recently financed two projects which have greatly cut costs and improved life; we have fitted a solar power system that has brought down their monthly energy cost from 7,000 shekels to 200 shekels; and we have installed a water cistern that is now providing them with clean water; until then water was delivered once a week and had to be paid for by the tanker load. Their biggest problem now is the salaries of the staff: the Palestinian Authority has run out of money and most staff are accepting half a salary or no salary at all until funds are made available. Funds are also needed for food, new mattresses, medicine, stationery... MET have guaranteed Jeel £4k a month, but their costs are more like £20k a month, and other funders have

The same is true for Al Shurooq. Their new sensory room, funded by the Trust, has to be seen to be believed. There are real problems getting blind children, some from Gaza, to school in these trying times, and staff there too are working for half pay or less. Doug says: "Please pray – and consider whether your church, or group of churches, could help financially, particularly during the next year when the funding crisis

se pray – and consider whether your church, or group of churches, could help financially, particularly during the next year when the funding crisis is at its peak. These children are part of the future in the Holy Land; but they need our love and support right now. Thank you."

Dear Family and Friends

10 Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. 1 Peter 4:10

As Christians, God calls us to use our gifts to serve others by doing what needs to be done. It is his work we are all involved in. You don't always manage at first and so we often need to go back and try again. Writing these guarterly letters help us to see what we have done and what still needs to be done.

April was a busy time for us dealing with the work in hand and preparing for our deputation in May and June. At the beginning of the month we welcomed Hannah and Erin, two medical students from the Edinburgh School of Medicine, who were doing a month-long Tropical Medicine Elective.



nultaneously, Dr Chikwanda arrived from Lusaka to run the Endo Workshop. He was followed by Jane and Maggie from Hands around the World who came to do an on-site visit and look at how that organisation might support our work at Mwandi. Ida then departed for Lusaka to chair the CHAZ Board Meeting. Keith remained with Mubita and ensured that workers' wages and other financial commitments could be met in our absence. There were similar requirements regarding chicken and fish feed as well as guarry dust sand and cement for the lock-making

Keith and Mubita then joined Ida and spent our last weekend before fiving with Catriona. Will and the grandchildren in Lusaka. We left on Sunday 28 and were met in Edinburgh by Kirsten. We spent a few days with them before moving into our furlough flat on the Thursday. Marjorie Clark, an old friend from World Mission and now an interim moderator in Perth, picked us up and drove us to Callender for the start of our Presbytery of Perth deputation.

It was good to catch up and thank Jeff, Dorothy and the congregation there for their faithful support. In the evening, we had our usual evening with SI Serfs, enjoying the music and fellowship. Towards the end of the week, we visited Brechin and Farnell for the first time and were warmly welcomed by Adriaan, Sanelle and their congregation. The next day was Stanley Primary School in the morning followed by the lunch-time Fellowship at Luncarty, Rev Susan Thorburn, whom we met in NE Fife on previous furloughs as a community at chaptain, know occash introduction when the first rate in the first order of the second states of the to Dunkeld for a Tuesday evening meeting where we were once again warmly received.

On our return from Perth we had our Debriefing, our eyes checked and our Psychological Assessments: these were on-line for the first time. On Saturday, the General Assembly opened, with us attending as Commissioners for the first time. It was good to learn where the Church is at the moment and where it wants to go. The Rev Shaw Paterson took over as Moderator from Rev Sally Foster-Fulton. Getting down to business, reforms and finance took centre stage with the Church working to balance its budget by 2027. While savings are being made, the most deprived areas should not be forgotten. Calls were made for the cost of the Assembly itself to be reduced. Most Presbytery Mission Plans were now in place.

Joanne Billeh, a Palestinian Christian, now living in Jordan, spoke movingly of how she and her family had been personally dispossessed by the conflict. The Assembly called for an immediate and permanent ceasefire, a stop the export of armaments to Israel and the implementation of a two-State solution.

The establishment of a Committee to consider the Church's work with social justice, ecumenical and interfaith matters and work with international partners was moved. Ida spoke congratulating Central Africa Churches for their work over the past 100 years but urged the Kirk not to forget the valuable work done previously by the former World Mission. She spoke of the drought currently affecting the area. The Church should continue to look out to the wider Church and make its valued contribution there too. The Great Commission does not stop in Jerusalem. Other major topics discussed were Social Care, the shortage of Armed Forces Chaplains, Assisted-Dying and Safe-guarding. The Guild also reported on its significant work at home and overseas

As Commissioners we were invited to a variety of social functions where we were able to meet other delegates from Scotland, other British Churches and from overseas; these included visitors from the Central Africa Churches, the Middle East, the Uniting Church of Australia, the Italian Waldensians and Hungary, Our Arrice churches, the Middle cast, the Onling Church of Adustrala, the failuar Valoratians and Hongary. Our invited guest from the Egyptian Church was not granted a visa by the Home Office. The Duke of Edinburgh was the High Commissioner this year. We were invited for a glass of prosecco and some canapes at Holyrood on the very wet Wednesday evening, introduced to His Grace, who encouraged us to keep up the good work

Once the Assembly was over we headed to Lochaber and Appin where we were hosted once again by Malcolm and Marion Kinnear. We spoke at Kinlochieven, Duror and Fort William on the Sunday and at a Presbytery Zoom Meeting on the Monday. We were invited to become the Mission Partners for all of the Presbytery of Cleir Eilean I.

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On the Sunday morning, we took the electric bus to Bridge of Earn baby clothes and blankets and were picked up by our old friend Rey Valerie Walker and taken to the moming service at Newburgh with Abdie, the Parish of Lindores. This was Ida's Dad's former charge so it was a special time together with old friends, great to see such a lively and missional congregation and to enjoy a tasty lunch together. A special thanks to Natalie for taking us all the way to the park and ride at North Queensferry. It shortened our bus journey considerabl

Next followed a meeting organised by Ian Alexander and Liz Grant to see if Edinburgh University could perhaps help Mwandi Mission Hospital now it was a General Hospital. Liz and her team were receptive to them looking at Rural Health Care, help with visits from a Surgical Unit and capacity building through research being undertaken in Mwandi. She also set up a meeting with the Scottish Government's Zambia

We met Niall and Mulenga at Victoria Quay and they went through what was on offer from the Scottish Government and pointed us towards the Non-communicable Disease Programme for a later date. Charles Sim joined us. He is head of Fair Trade in Scotland and involved with Eco-Congregations. Through him, we have managed to become members of the Church's Credit Union and we will look at a Toilet Twinning at Sikuzu Primary School. Keith went for an X-ray which was normal that afternoon; then a very enjoy dinner with Valerie, Duncan, Jennie and Ainsley - old World Mission friends

It was good too, to be able to celebrate Iona's 12th Birthday in Lenzie with all the family including Ina and Duncan. The next weekend we caught up with Eric and Helen in Strathmiglo then on to Muriel and Jim's in St Andrews for the Coffee Morning and Plant sale at St Marks.



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We next started to work in Fife with the Sunday service at Dunfermline Abbey. Later in the week we were given the opportunity to speak to pupils at two schools in Fife. The children were ledgeable and asked very good questions.

On our days off we tried to meet up with family and friends and spend some time with them. Gregor, Maia and Elsi came up for a few days during half-term. We have also seen Kirsten, Stuart Iona and Euan on a few occasions as well. Our old friends Jackie and




